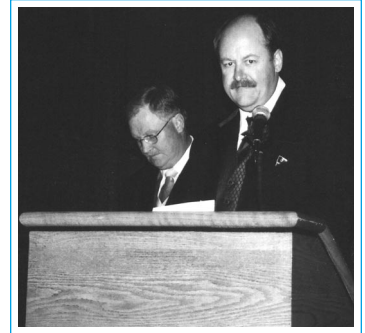

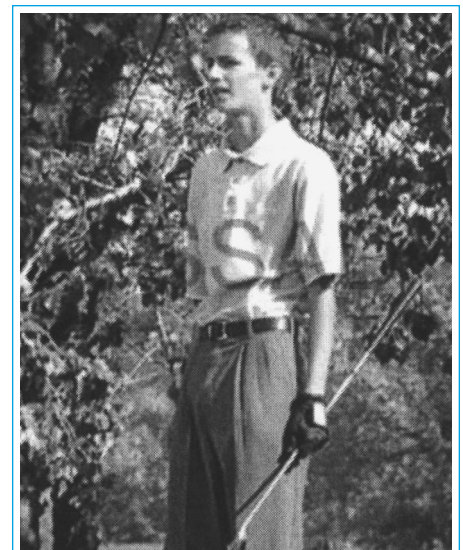

High School Golf Tees Off in 2005

The SCISSONS FAMILY GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP has been established to promote this lifetime sport within the high school community. The generous donation of life insurance policies by Jim & Donna Scissons has established golf as one of the fall sport activities available to the students of Saskatoon's high schools.

In its inaugural year, nine local high schools/collegiates participated in the golf program. Each school team consisted of four boys and four girls. The spring (May, June) portion of the program involved instruction, practice

and limited play time through cooperation with the Saskatchewan Golf Association's Future Links Program under the coaching expertise of Jeff Chambers. After another practice period at the beginning of September, the city championships were held at the Saskatoon Golf & Country Club West Course. The top team, the top three boys and the top three girls went on to the Provincial Championships in Swift Current. Organizers are extremely pleased with this first year of the program and are hopeful that there will be significant growth and improvement in this next year.

Animal Tracking, Wilderness Survival and the Wonder of Water.

A group of volunteers, including teachers, students and parents has completed a five year population and productivity study of migratory songbirds breeding on the Scissons site. Through a partnership with the

Institute for Bird Population in Point Reyes, California this information will give insights into environmental issues ranging from situational pollution to global warming. The Environmental Education Department also maintains partnerships with The Saskatoon Zoo Society, The Meewasin Valley Authority, The Saskatoon Environmental Society, Ducks Unlimited and the University of Saskatchewan Extension Division.

A quarter section of natural prairie associated with the Eagle Creek coulee system was bequeathed to the Saskatoon Catholic Schools Foundation by the Scissons Family in honor of their parents Ed and May Scissons with the understanding the property would be used to teach children about nature. The Saskatoon Catholic Schools Environmental Education Department was enlisted to develop and present programs based on the study of prairie ecology and environmental issues. The Ed and May Scissons site serves as an outdoor classroom for programs in Archaeology, Aquatic Ecosystems, Birding, Geography, Watercolors,
