Students from Grades 9 to 12 will perform a variety of musical pieces as one large band, along with special guest Dean McNeil on trumpet. McNeil is an associate professor of music at the U of S. The magic of Music Monday is that at the same point during the morning (11:00 a.m. Saskatoon time), schools right across the country are united by one piece of music. The melody is provided to schools in a variety of arrangements suitable for performers of all ages, from primary choirs through to senior high school bands and orchestras.

Music Monday is organized by the Coalition for Music Education in Canada with the idea that if Canadians across the country step out of their homes or offices on Monday, May 7th, they will hear music and the skies will be filled with melody.
